

WEST GATE TUNNEL PROJECT



BACKGROUND





The West Gate tunnel is a Victorian Government initiative providing **JOHN** an alternative route to the West Gate Bridge in Melbourne's west. The project involves building four additional lanes on the West Gate Freeway, twin tunnels under Yarraville and a new bridge over the Maribyrnong River.

PROJECT

The Victorian government set a project initiative to encourage Indigenous Australians entry and involvement. Goal IS worked with our partners and clients to provide a unique training program and AWU agreement which made an Indigenous pre-apprenticeship program possible.

The Indigenous trainee group of three women and seven men completed a four week preemployment program at Kangan Institute, prior to starting on-site.

The program focused on providing trainees with safe work skills and hands-on training to learn

practical skills needed for working on major infrastructure projects. This included how to read engineering plans and drawings, and how to use a range of tools and equipment.

While working on the West Gate Tunnel Project, the trainees will also complete a Civil Construction Certificate III over 18 months.

The trainee group occupies various roles across the West Gate Tunnel's five major worksites in Melbourne's west.

Goal IS provided a support and mentoring program to ensure a smooth transition into the workforce. Dean Rioli continues to manage and mentor this group above and beyond, receiving accolades from candidates and clients.
